

Connecting and Creating: Surprise collaboration between Chicago Sinfonietta and Shedd Aquarium inspires, delights, and highlights the communicative power of sound in nature and music

CHICAGO, **IL** – Chicago Sinfonietta partnered with Shedd Aquarium to present a surprise performance in the aquarium's Abbott Oceanarium. Motivated by the recent naming of Shedd's newest beluga calf, Opus (OH-pus), the exciting collaboration highlighted the importance of sound in nature – particularly for belugas to communicate and navigate their world, and its parallels to the importance of sound in the human world. The pop-up event delighted guests visiting Shedd Aquarium.

Chicago Sinfonietta violinists **Edith Yokely** and **Caroline Slack**, Assistant Principal violist **Seth Pae**, and Assistant Principal cellist **Ann Griffin** gave two performances: a "private" performance around Shedd's Secluded Bay habitat – home of the resident beluga whale pod at Shedd - prior to the opening of the aquarium. The string quartet performed Beethoven's "Ode to Joy" from his Symphony No. 9 and themes from his Symphony No. 6, "The Pastoral." Ms. Griffin also performed Bach's Unaccompanied Cello Suite No. 1 for Opus. The second performance of the same works took place for the public once the aquarium opened, delighting visitors.
